

This stretch of the Namekagon River passes through high sandy banks with many sharp bends. It offers canoeists a wilderness-like experience because little development is visible from the river. The river flows east to west through pines and mixed hardwoods. River currents and water levels vary depending on the amount of precipitation the watershed receives. This stretch normally offers good canoeing all season with current speed averaging three miles per hour.

Ownership of **Riverside Landing** will be transferred from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation to the National Park Service in 2002. Renovation of the landing is planned for summer, 2003. Drinking water will not be available until the renovation is complete.



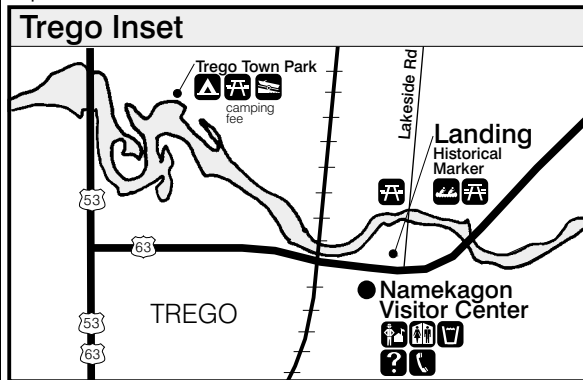
